Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 45 (c), (d), (e), and (g) (Effective 12/1/13)

(c) Place of Compliance.

(1) For a Trial, Hearing, or Deposition. A subpoena may command a person to attend a trial, hearing, or deposition only as follows:

- (A) within 100 miles of where the person resides, is employed, or regularly transacts business in person; or
- (B) within the state where the person resides, is employed, or regularly transacts business in person, if the person
 - (i) is a party or a party's officer; or
 - (ii) is commanded to attend a trial and would not incur substantial expense.

(2) For Other Discovery. A subpoena may command:

- (A) production of documents, electronically stored information, or tangible things at a place within 100 miles of where the person resides, is employed, or regularly transacts business in person; and
- (B) inspection of premises at the premises to be inspected.

(d) Protecting a Person Subject to a Subpoena; Enforcement.

(1) Avoiding Undue Burden or Expense; Sanctions. A party or attorney responsible for issuing and serving a subpoena must take reasonable steps to avoid imposing undue burden or expense on a person subject to the subpoena. The court for the district where compliance is required must enforce this duty and impose an appropriate sanction—which may include lost earnings and reasonable attorney's fees—on a party or attorney who fails to comply.

(2) Command to Produce Materials or Permit Inspection.

(A) *Appearance Not Required.* A person commanded to produce documents, electronically stored information, or tangible things, or to permit the inspection of premises, need not appear in person at the place of production or inspection unless also commanded to appear for a deposition, hearing, or trial.

(B) *Objections.* A person commanded to produce documents or tangible things or to permit inspection may serve on the party or attorney designated in the subpoena a written objection to inspecting, copying, testing, or sampling any or all of the materials or to inspecting the premises—or to producing electronically stored information in the form or forms requested. The objection must be served before the earlier of the time specified for compliance or 14 days after the subpoena is served. If an objection is made, the following rules apply:

- (i) At any time, on notice to the commanded person, the serving party may move the court for the district where compliance is required for an order compelling production or inspection.
- (ii) These acts may be required only as directed in the order, and the order must protect a person who is neither a party nor a party's officer from significant expense resulting from compliance.

(3) Quashing or Modifying a Subpoena.

(A) *When Required.* On timely motion, the court for the district where compliance is required must quash or modify a subpoena that:

- (i) fails to allow a reasonable time to comply;
- (ii) requires a person to comply beyond the geographical limits specified in Rule 45(c);
- (iii) requires disclosure of privileged or other protected matter, if no exception or waiver applies; or
- (iv) subjects a person to undue burden.

(B) *When Permitted.* To protect a person subject to or affected by a subpoena, the court for the district where compliance is required may, on motion, quash or modify the subpoena if it requires:

- (i) disclosing a trade secret or other confidential research, development, or commercial information; or

(ii) disclosing an unretained expert's opinion or information that does not describe specific occurrences in dispute and results from the expert's study that was not requested by a party.

(C) *Specifying Conditions as an Alternative.* In the circumstances described in Rule 45(d)(3)(B), the court may, instead of quashing or modifying a subpoena, order appearance or production under specified conditions if the serving party:

- (i) shows a substantial need for the testimony or material that cannot be otherwise met without undue hardship; and
- (ii) ensures that the subpoenaed person will be reasonably compensated.

(e) Duties in Responding to a Subpoena.

(1) Producing Documents or Electronically Stored Information. These procedures apply to producing documents or electronically stored information:

(A) *Documents.* A person responding to a subpoena to produce documents must produce them as they are kept in the ordinary course of business or must organize and label them to correspond to the categories in the demand.

(B) *Form for Producing Electronically Stored Information Not Specified.* If a subpoena does not specify a form for producing electronically stored information, the person responding must produce it in a form or forms in which it is ordinarily maintained or in a reasonably usable form or forms.

(C) *Electronically Stored Information Produced in Only One Form.* The person responding need not produce the same electronically stored information in more than one form.

(D) *Inaccessible Electronically Stored Information.* The person responding need not provide discovery of electronically stored information from sources that the person identifies as not reasonably accessible because of undue burden or cost. On motion to compel discovery or for a protective order, the person responding must show that the information is not reasonably accessible because of undue burden or cost. If that showing is made, the court may nonetheless order discovery from such sources if the requesting party shows good cause, considering the limitations of Rule 26(b)(2)(C). The court may specify conditions for the discovery.

(2) Claiming Privilege or Protection.

(A) *Information Withheld.* A person withholding subpoenaed information under a claim that it is privileged or subject to protection as trial-preparation material must:

- (i) expressly make the claim; and
- (ii) describe the nature of the withheld documents, communications, or tangible things in a manner that, without revealing information itself privileged or protected, will enable the parties to assess the claim.

(B) *Information Produced.* If information produced in response to a subpoena is subject to a claim of privilege or of protection as trial-preparation material, the person making the claim may notify any party that received the information of the claim and the basis for it. After being notified, a party must promptly return, sequester, or destroy the specified information and any copies it has; must not use or disclose the information until the claim is resolved; must take reasonable steps to retrieve the information if the party disclosed it before being notified; and may promptly present the information under seal to the court for the district where compliance is required for a determination of the claim. The person who produced the information must preserve the information until the claim is resolved.

(g) Contempt.

The court for the district where compliance is required—and also, after a motion is transferred, the issuing court—may hold in contempt a person who, having been served, fails without adequate excuse to obey the subpoena or an order related to it.

Attachment A

Pursuant to Rule 45 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, and in accordance with the instructions and definitions listed below, Plaintiffs Centro Presente, *et al.* (“Plaintiffs”) request that Trump Productions, LLC (“Trump”) produce the following documents and things for inspection and copying at the Lawyers’ Committee for Civil Rights, 61 Batterymarch Street, 5th Floor, Boston, Massachusetts, 02110, to the attention of Oren Nimni, Esq.

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Plaintiffs request that Trump search for all documents and things within its possession, custody, or control, wherever located, including, but not limited to, any documents or things placed in storage facilities or in the possession of any employee, agent, representative, attorney, investigator, or other person acting or purporting to act on Trump’s behalf in order to respond to these requests.
2. Plaintiffs request that Trump produce the documents and things as they are kept in the usual course of business or organize and label them to correspond with the document requests to which they are responsive. If there are no documents or things responsive to either of the requests, Plaintiffs request that Trump state so in writing rather than leave the request unanswered.
3. If Trump comes into possession, custody, or control of responsive documents or things between the time of initial production and the time of trial herein, Plaintiffs request that Trump supplement its earlier production by promptly producing such documents and things.
4. If Trump objects to producing and withholds from production any information, documents, or things requested herein on grounds of attorney-client privilege, work-product immunity, or otherwise, Plaintiffs request that Trump state so in writing.

DEFINITIONS

For purposes of these requests, terms not specifically defined shall be given their ordinary meaning. If Trump does not understand the meaning of any term, please seek clarification immediately through Plaintiffs' counsel.

1. The terms "Trump Productions, LLC," "Trump," or "You" mean Trump Productions, LLC and all predecessors and/or successors thereto; all affiliated companies thereof; all divisions or subsidiaries thereof, whether wholly or partially owned; all parents thereof, whether whole or partial owner; and all partners, directors, owners, officers, members, employees, representatives, agents, and any other persons under the control of Trump, including but not limited to Trump's counsel, and any third parties working Trump or under Trump's direction and control.

2. The term "*The Apprentice*" refers to all fifteen seasons of the U.S. television series, including both the original *Apprentice* and *Celebrity Apprentice*.

3. "Donald J. Trump" refers to the current President of the United States of America.

4. The terms "concerning" and "regarding" mean comprising, containing, constituting, reflecting, discussing, describing, showing, evidencing, embodying, describing, supporting, contradicting, refuting, identifying, summarizing, reporting, relating to, pertaining to, referring to, or in any way logically or factually connected with the stated matter.

5. The terms "possession," "custody," and "control" are used in a comprehensive sense and refer to possession, custody, or control by any one or a combination of the following persons or organizations:

- (a) Trump;
- (b) any corporation or other entity controlled by Trump, affiliated with Trump, or controlling Trump as its wholly or partially owned subsidiary;

- (c) any principal, officer, employee, agent, representative, or consultant of or for Trump or any such controlled or affiliated corporation or entity;
- (d) counsel for Trump or any such controlled or affiliated corporation or entity; and
- (e) any person, corporation, or entity working for or on the behalf of Trump.

REQUESTS FOR PRODUCTION

1. Any and all unaired video footage, out-takes, audio clips, and/or transcripts created during the production of *The Apprentice* in which Donald J. Trump:
 - (a) uses racial and/or ethnic slurs; and/or
 - (b) makes remarks concerning race, nationality, and/or ethnic background.
2. Any and all compilations and compositions, including those comprised of video and/or audio clips, in which Donald J. Trump:
 - (a) uses racial and/or ethnic slurs; and/or
 - (b) makes remarks concerning race, nationality, and/or ethnic background.
